- Pick up ends at 3:15pm.
- Please ensure that you are not gathering in groups outside the gate and that masks are worn. Parents are asked to exit the site as soon as possible after collecting their children.

**Office:** As we endeavour to limit parents on site, we have set up a table outside the Office to drop off anything you may need to drop off. (hat, drink bottle - make sure all items are clearly labeled).

Parents are asked to phone the Office to pay fees, speak to Office staff, or to request a phone call from a teacher. Please scan and send Enrolment forms too.

If a child has been injured and you must enter the Office (doors are locked) you will need to QR code in and wear a mask. We thank you for your support and patience as we follow government protocols/Health Orders around safety and health.

# Drive Through reminders:

- Children are to exit cars on the left hand side for safety reasons.
- Please do not get out of your car children must be able to undo their seatbelt, pick up their bag and exit the vehicle independently. Please do NOT send children to car boots/hatches as this is extremely unsafe. Bags must be kept on the seat/car floor with your children.
- We thank you for helping to keep all children safe.

Children at school: Any child with COVID-19 symptoms will be sent home and should not return until they have received a negative test result and are symptom-free. In circumstances where children have other medical reasons for recurring symptoms, a letter from their GP is sufficient to negate the requirement for a negative test.

For anyone who has been diagnosed with COVID19, a Health Department letter must be supplied prior to re-entry. Anyone who has COVID-19 symptoms has to get tested immediately and stay in isolation until receiving a negative COVID-19 test result. Anyone contacted by NSW Health must follow the advice they have been given, particularly about getting tested and self-isolating.

Sunday, 31st October 2021: THIRTY-FIRST Sunday in Ordinary Time - Year B

#### *Mk* 12:28-34 This is the first commandment, and the second is similar to it.

One of the scribes came up to Jesus and put a question to him, 'Which is the first of all the commandments?' Jesus replied, 'This is the first: Listen, Israel, the Lord our God is the one Lord, and you must love the Lord you God with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your mind, and with all your strength. The second is this: You must love your neighbour as yourself. There is no commandment greater than these.' The scribe said to him, 'Well spoken, Master; what you have said is true: that he is one and there is no other. To love him with all your heart, with all your understanding and strength, and to love your neighbour as yourself, this is far more important than any holocaust or sacrifice.' Jesus, seeing how wisely he had spoken, said, 'You are not far from the kingdom of God.' And after that no one dared to question him any more.

#### **October World Mission Month**

Jesus' mission of creating a world where all can live a fully dignified life is still far from completion. Therefore, the Church dedicates the entire month of October to reflect on the central mission of the Church: spreading the Good News of Jesus Christ to the ends of the earth. All classes have been learning about how living out Mercy Values are connected to this mission and how to make a positive difference in our world. They also enjoyed wearing a crazy pair of socks today, as part of our Socktober event 'Sock it to Poverty'.

Pope Francis' message for World Mission Sunday this year reflects on the theme: **"We cannot but speak about what we have seen and heard" (Acts 4:20).** He reminds us that, "as Christians, we cannot keep the Lord to ourselves," as we "recall with gratitude all those men and women who by their testimony of life help us to renew our baptismal commitment to be generous and joyful apostles of the Gospel." 

QKR! is an easy to use mobile phone application that is also suitable for both iPhone and Android Smartphones. This service is currently available for all payments except for school fees. # Semester 2 2021 School Academic Reports

The Diocesan Tuition Fee and School Building Levy are annual fees billed in Terms 1, 2 and 3. A pro rata fee based on weeks enrolled for the year is made for students entering the School part way during a term. If a student leaves the School during a term, no refund will be made in respect of the remaining portion of that term. Other School Based Fees for items such as camps, excursions, materials or technology may be charged to a student's account and are payable under the same conditions as Diocesan Fees. A Term's notice in writing must be given to the School Principal before the withdrawal of a student or a full term's fees will be payable.

In Week 9, parents and carers will receive their child's/children's school report electronically via the Compass Parent Portal. Moving forward, Semester Reports will no longer be printed to take home with your child/children. If you have not provided the school your email address or if you are unable to log into the Compass Parent Portal, please contact the school office.
