QKR! is an easy to use mobile phone application that is also suitable for both iPhone and Android Smartphones. This service is currently available for all payments except for school fees. Attendance

Attendance - Every School Day Counts! Here Everyday Ready On Time - Morning Bell 8:55 am!

Regular attendance at school is critical to ensuring that every student has the kind of opportunities in life that he or she deserves. Non-attendance has a variety of effects on students, both academically and socially. As you are aware, every day of attendance at school adds to your child's chances of success and achievement from Kindergarten through to high school.

Every day at school counts towards your child's learning!

Absences add up quickly. If your child is absent 1 day every 2 weeks over the course of a school year, this will add up to 20 days loss of education. This is almost half a school term in a year!

If your child is absent due to illness, please inform the school by entering in COMPASS Parent Portal, or send us an email. Alternatively you can always contact our school office and explain absences on the day. When a student is away for more than two days, a Medical Certificate will be

required when returning to school.

Notification of Student Leaving	Leave of Absence
The Diocesan Tuition Fee and School Building Levy are annual fees billed in Terms 1, 2 and 3. A pro rata fee based on weeks enrolled for the year is made for students entering the School part way during a term. If a student leaves the School during a term, no refund will be made in respect of the remaining portion of that term. Other School Based Fees for items such as camps, excursions, materials or technology may be charged to a student's account and are payable under the same conditions as Diocesan Fees. A Term's notice in writing must be given to the School Principal before the withdrawal of a student or a full term's fees will be payable.	If your child is going on extended leave greater than 5 days, an Application for Exemption Form must be completed and returned to the office prior to the leave date. Please complete the following form <u>Application Extended Leave</u> . This leave will be considered by the Principal for approval. <i>Please note that any Leave time taken during term will</i> <i>impact on your child's learning. Our Diocesan mantra is,</i> <i>'Every Child, Every Day' and students are legally obliged to</i> <i>attend school every day of the school year. Holidays and</i> <i>Leave should ideally be taken in school holiday periods.</i>
