Ash Wednesday

On the 22nd of February we gathered to celebrate Ash Wednesday, a day when we remember who we are and how much God loves us. Ash Wednesday is the start of a special season in our liturgical calendar called Lent. Over the next 40 days, we will take extra steps to strengthen our relationship with God, by fasting, extra prayer and service to others.

The ashes remind us of life and death and of our need for God. The ashes symbolise the dust from which God made us. As the priest applies the ashes to a person's forehead, he says: "Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return." Ashes are a symbol of penance made sacramental by the blessing of the Church, and they help us develop a spirit of humility and sacrifice. We now enter the second Sunday of Lent. We continue our journey through the desert with Jesus. We pray:

O God, who has commanded us to listen to your beloved Son, be pleased, we pray, to nourish us inwardly by your word, that, with spiritual sight made pure, we may rejoice to behold your glory. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God, for ever and ever. Amen.

On the 27th February we gathered as a community to spend some time reflecting on the Mercy charism. The Mercy charism has been handed down to us from the Parramatta Sisters of Mercy, who founded our school in 1919 and remained with us until 2001. On this day we remember the founder of the Sisters of Mercy, Catherine McAuley who we derive our Mercy Values from. Students learnt about the Mercy Values by participating in different activities such as art, charades and even a scavenger hunt. Students also brought home a Hand of Mercy template to share with their families and to come up with ways we can show mercy to others. Premier's Reading Challenge

The Challenge aims to encourage a love of reading for leisure and pleasure in students, and to enable them to experience guality literature. It is not a competition but a challenge to each student to read, to read more and to read more widely. The Premier's Reading Challenge (PRC) is open to all NSW students in Kindergarten to Year 10, in government, independent, Catholic and home schools.

Key dates for the 2023 challenge are: 27 February 2023 - challenge opens for student entries Friday 18 August 2023 - challenge closes for student entries.

As was the case last year, students from Years 3-6 will be required to enter their books read into the PRC book log independently. Children from Kindergarten - Year 2 will have their books entered on their behalf by their teachers based on the books that they have read in class throughout the year. Year 3-6 passwords are the same as in previous years, copies of each child's login details will be distributed in the coming weeks.

Book Fair

Our first Book Fair for 2023 will take place during Week 8 (March 13th-17th) to coincide with our St Patrick's Day Celebrations. We will be open for parents/carers and children to purchase every morning during Week 8 from 8:30am-9am and in the afternoons from 3:00-3:30pm Monday to Friday. Your child will be given an opportunity to preview the books for sale prior to the commencement of the Book Fair and fill in a Wish List. Purchases may also be made (EFTPOS) on the Picnic/Reading afternoon.

CSPD Family Clinic

2023 NSW PREMIER'S

READING CHALLENGE As you may be aware, 2023 NAPLAN testing will be held from 15 March 2023. There will also be changes to the way that NAPLAN results are reported. Parents and carers will get earlier and simpler information about their child's NAPLAN achievement based on the following 4 levels of achievement:

- Exceeding
- Strong
- Developing
- Needs additional support.

The descriptors for each category will make it clear to parents what their child's literacy and numeracy skills are at the time of NAPLAN testing, and we will continue to work with you to meet your child's needs. NAPLAN will remain one of many useful ways that we assess your child's learning and support needs.

Please be aware of NAPLAN testing dates, as outlined below:

Learning News - What's happening in classrooms

We are excited this year to share that our focus on learning is around 'Challenge.' In Numeracy, the leadership team recently participated in an "Excellence in Mathematics' professional development course. Our aim is to build a culture of how mathematics is taught in our classrooms that ensures each student is challenged as they progress in their understanding, skills and disposition to use mathematics. We hope you hear all about the great mathematics that is happening!

Our Year 6 students (and teachers) are learning to use video through literacy. Students will learn the skills of storytelling using technology. This is only their second week of learning so we can't wait to see and share their video productions.

For our Kinder and Year 1 students, they are participating in Wired for Sound. This exciting project uses music and singing to increase coordination and focus on literacy learning. Their attention to learn the words, match the pitch and coordinate a clap, click and patch is amazing. They sound fantastic and they are concentrating super hard!
