Q: I want my child to do well in reading. How can I set high expectations without nagging? : It's important to keep a positive attitude about reading. You want to encourage it without making it seem like a chore. Replace any negative words ("You have to read well or you'll fail.") with positive talk

and daily activities ("Reading can help us learn about almost anything! Let's think of something really cool to read about this week.").

#### Three ways to encourage your reader

The more exciting reading is, the more your child may be encouraged to keep reading! To motivate your child to read:

- 1. Play board games that involve reading.
- **2. Build activities** around what your child is reading. Act out the story or do crafts that relate to it, for example.



3. Keep a reading calendar. Mark the days that he starts and finishes a book.



: My child is learning to read, but it's hard for her. She doesn't want to pick up books at home. How can I help? : Make books around the house as appealing as possible. Choose stories that include mostly familiar words. Look for subjects she loves or new topics she

might embrace. Also consider books with short items to read, such as jokes or rhymes. Books with appealing pictures are great, too!

#### Ask questions to get your child thinking and talking about reading

It is critical that your child read over the summer. Help her reflect on what she reads and improve her

- comprehension by asking a lot of questions! You might ask: Who were the main characters? What did you like or dislike about them? Do they remind you of people you know? How? What happened in th e story?
- How did it start? What happened in the middle? How did it end? Were you happy with the way the book ended?



What would you change about the book if you were the author? What plot would make a good sequel?

### News from Mrs Preston

#### Wellbeing for Learning

We are taking part in a new and exciting project at St Patrick's aimed at student wellbeing. The evidence between learning and a child's wellbeing is strong. The more a child feels safe and supported at school the better their learning outcomes. This project will involve a series of surveys completed on a weekly basis that capture how a child is feeling at school. This data will provide us with ways to support children and their learning. #### School Departure changes

Has your child changed the way that they are leaving school in the afternoon? If so, please advise us by completing this form "Going Home Procedures". We have an increasing number of children that are being picked up by parents from Newton Road. Please remind your children that this is a busy road and that if they are waiting for you to pick them up, they are to wait safely near the school gate until a teacher sees a parent/carer. Supervision finishes at 3:20 pm so if your child is still waiting we will take them up to the office for pick up. Your child's safety is our concern. We won't leave a child on the side of the road by themselves. We ask for your assistance in picking them up prior to 3:20 pm or alternatively from the front office.



#### e-Safety

We are having an increasing number of children coming to school reporting incidents that are happening online during gaming or through social media outside of school. We are very appreciative that children are asking teachers for help and support. We urge you to have these conversations with your child about what they are doing and experiencing online. In today's society we know that cyberbullying is on the rise and it is happening at very young ages. There are still some upcoming webinars available for you to support your child's safety online through the eSafety Commissioner. In particular, there is a recorded video and some fact sheets around children being safe whilst gaming and how to protect themselves. The Diocesan Tuition Fee and School Building Levy are annual fees billed in Terms 1, 2 and 3. A pro rata fee based on weeks enrolled for the year is made for students entering the School part way during a term. If a student leaves the
School during a term, no refund will be made in respect of the
remaining portion of that term. Other School Based Fees for items such as camps, excursions, materials or technology
may be charged to a student's account and are payable under
the same conditions as Diocesan Fees. A Term's notice in
writing must be given to the School Principal before the
withdrawal of a student or a full term's fees will be payable.

**Notification of Student Leaving** 

If your child is going on extended leave greater than 5 days, an **Application for Exemption Form** must be completed and returned to the office prior to the leave date. Please complete the following form <u>Application Extended Leave</u>. This leave will be considered by the Principal for approval.

Leave of Absence

Please note that any Leave time taken during term will impact on your child's learning. Our Diocesan mantra is, 'Every Child, Every Day' and students are legally obliged to attend school every day of the school year. Holidays and Leave should ideally be taken in school holiday periods.

## Kindergarten Enrolments 2024


